

Day 1 and 2 USA to the Holy Land Your spiritual pilgrimage begins as you depart on your international flight. You will be welcomed to **Amman, Jordan** by our representative and transferred to the hotel for dinner and overnight.

Day 3 Petra Today you will travel south from Amman to the famous Rock City of **Petra**. Just getting to Petra is an adventure. You can ride a horse or carriage or walk to and down the Siq, the long, narrow entrance into Petra. Once there, you’ll marvel at the rose-colored rock and extensive carving. A whole city was literally cut into the cliff sides. Return to Amman for overnight stay.

Day 4 Mount Nebo, Jerash and Tiberias Look out over the Promised Land like Moses from the top of **Mt. Nebo** (Deuteronomy 34), where on a clear day you can see a vast portion of Israel. Later this morning you will explore **Jerash**, one of the best-preserved Roman cities in the world. Stroll through the oval piazza and wander along colonnaded streets etched by the wheels of ancient chariots. Stand in the grand theatre where an onstage whisper can be heard in the top row. Later in the day, you will cross the King Hussein Bridge into Israel. Travel north to **Golan Heights**, the most northern part of Israel to view the area, then finish your day in Tiberias at your hotel for dinner and overnight stay.

Day 5 The Galilee With your Bible in hand, cross the waters of the **Sea of Galilee** aboard a Kinnereth Sailing Company boat. Along the way, you will enjoy a special on board worship service. Visit **Kibbutz Nof Ginosaur** and learn about the “Ancient Boat”, a rare and excellent example of the kind of boat in which Jesus would

have sailed. Travel to the **Mount of Beatitudes** where Jesus preached to the people (Matt. 5-7). At **Tabgha**, you’ll visit the **Church of the Fish and the Loaves** (Luke 9:10-17). You’ll arrive in **Capernaum**, where Jesus chose to center his ministry. Visit the synagogue site where Jesus most certainly taught and worshiped (Matt. 4:13; Mark 3:1, 8:5 and 14). Visualize life in Jesus’ day when you visit **Chorazim**, a reconstructed city that, along with Capernaum, was cursed by Jesus because the inhabitants did not comprehend his teachings (Matt. 11:21-22). Stop at the **Yardenit Baptismal** site, situated where the Jordan River flows out of the Sea of Galilee on its way to the Dead Sea and enjoy the peace and tranquility of the natural surroundings at the river where Christ was baptized by John the Baptist (Mark 1: 9-11).

Day 6 Beit Shean, Nazareth, Megiddo and Caesarea Visit the ruins of **Beit Shean**, which was continuously inhabited for 5000 years and was one of the Roman cities Jesus passed on his way from Galilee to Jerusalem. View **Mt. Tabor**, possible Mt. of Transfiguration site. Recall Jesus’ first miracle as you ride through **Cana** (Jn. 2: 1-11). Travel through **Nazareth**, boyhood home of Jesus (Mt. 2:23) then overlook **Jezebel Valley** from **Mt. Precipice** outlook. Travel the ancient caravan route to **Tel Megiddo** where 20 different cities lie superimposed upon each other. Visit the **Roman Aqueduct** and **Theatre at Caesarea**, a center of the early Christians. Here, Cornelius became the first Gentile convert to the new religion (Acts 10) and Paul was imprisoned before being taken to Rome for trial. Continue to **Jerusalem** and look out over the city before checking into your hotel for dinner and overnight stay.

Day 7 Jerusalem, Masada, Ein Gedi, Qumran and Jericho Visit the **Model of First Century Jerusalem** at the **Israel Museum**. Enjoy a service at the **BYU Jerusalem Center**. Then depart south for **Masada**, Herod’s mountaintop fortress that became the last stronghold of the Jewish Rebellion against the Romans. Ride the cable car to the top to explore. Peer down upon the remains of the Roman camps and siege ramp below. Look out over the oasis of **Ein Gedi**, where David and his men sought refuge from Saul (1 Samuel 23). Travel to **Qumran**, site of the Dead Sea Scroll discovery, to discuss the mysterious community of the Essenes who once lived on the shores of the Dead Sea. You’ll stop at the Shores of the **Dead Sea** for a quick dip in the salt and mineral laden waters, weather permitting. In **Jericho**, you will visit the ruins of the ancient city, which was conquered by Joshua (Josh. 6:20). From Jericho, you will see the traditional site of the Temptation of Jesus (Matt. 4:1-11). Return to Jerusalem for dinner and overnight stay.

Day 8 Bethany and Jerusalem Conditions permitting, visit the **Temple Mount**. Visit **Bethany**, the home of Lazarus, Mary and

Martha. Here Jesus visited on several occasions, and raised Lazarus from the dead (John 11). Enter the **Old City** and visit the **Southern Wall Excavations** of the Temple including the **Teaching Steps** and the **Western Wall**. Walk the **Cardo**, the ancient main street of the Old City once lined with shops, now partially restored. View the **Pool of Bethesda** (John 5: 1-31) where Jesus performed the Sabbath miracle, and sing a hymn in the **Church of St. Anne**. Visit **Herod’s Antonia Fortress** where Jesus was brought before Pontius Pilate (Luke 23: 1 - 11). Walk the **Via Dolorosa**, “the Way of the Cross”, and stand in reverence at the **Church of the Holy Sepulcher**. Visit the **Garden Tomb**, possible site of the garden of Joseph of Arimathea and experience the reality of the Resurrection.

Day 9 Bethlehem and Jerusalem In **Bethlehem**, you’ll visit the cave revered as the place Jesus was born (Matt. 1:18-25; Luke 2:1-7). The church, which was constructed on the site, is the world’s oldest functioning church. Nearby you will view **Shepherds’ Field** where the Good News was first heard. Stand atop the **Mount of Olives** as Jesus did and enjoy a remarkable view of the “Golden City” of **Jerusalem**, including the **Temple Mount** and **Dome of the Rock**. Visit the **Garden of Gethsemane** where Jesus prayed for God’s will to be done (Matt. 26:30). Forty days after his resurrection, Jesus ascended into heaven from the Mount of Olives (Acts 1:16). Stand in the **Upper Room**, revered as the site of the Last Supper (Mark 14:12-26). **Mt. Zion** is also where you’ll see **King David’s Tomb**. Visit the **House of the High Priest Caiaphas** (Matt. 26:57) where Jesus was imprisoned for a night. Those taking the extension will remain in Jerusalem for dinner and overnight stay. Those not continuing to Egypt will transfer for their late evening departure from Tel Aviv.

Day 10 Return to USA Return to the USA with eternal memories of the people and places of the Holy Land.



Every effort has been made to ensure the accuracy of this brochure. While you will see most all sites listed above, and more, the order of sites and/or days and number of days may be altered to accommodate changes in airline, hotel schedules, and local conditions. Due to airline schedules, some participants may receive one or two extra leisure days at a nominal per day charge and some extensions may not be available on all departure dates. Minimum of 10 passengers required to operate extension.

Day 10 Bonus day in Jerusalem! Visit the Israel Museum and the Shrine of the Book, where artifacts like the entire book of Isaiah, found among the Dead Sea Scrolls, are on display. Walk the museum and grounds of Yad Vashem, the Holocaust Museum, as a reminder of why we must never let this happen again. Then return to the Old City for time on your own to explore or shop. Those wanting to see a more modern area may want to visit Ben Yehudah Street, lined with restaurants and souvenir shops, not far from the hotel. Late afternoon departure from Jerusalem to the Allenby Bridge and Jordan. Continue to Amman for dinner and overnight.

Day 11 Today you will fly across the Sinai Peninsula and the Suez Canal to the city of Cairo, Egypt. Stop by the Sadat Tomb on the way to your hotel. Anwar Sadat partnered with Menachim Begin of Israel in the 1970's to bring peace between their two countries.

Day 12 Admire ancient treasures at the Egyptian Museum. Enjoy a felucca ride in the Nile River this afternoon.

Day 13 Visit the ancient capital of Memphis. The Step Pyramid can be seen at Sakkara. See the Great Pyramids of Giza and the Sphinx. Board overnight train to Luxor.

Day 14 & 15 Cross the Nile River to visit the world famous Valley of Kings and Queens (your lunches are included while in Luxor). After overnight in Luxor, visit the magnificent Karnak Temple and the Luxor Temple. Board flight to Cairo.

Day 16 Your morning is free. Pass through Christian Cairo and see the Citadel on your way to the airport for your return flight from Cairo.

Day 17 Return to the US with eternal memories of Israel, Jordan and Egypt!

President Spencer W. Kimball purportedly said "Every Latter-day Saint who can afford it should go to the Holy Land. It will change your life. I went, and it changed mine."

Opened in 1987 for students to live and learn in Israel, the Brigham Young University Jerusalem Center on Mount Scopus has become a popular place to visit for both Israelis and Palestinians. We will see the beautiful organ and main hall overlooking Jerusalem and the Temple Mount. Sacrament meeting planned.



One of the small but significant places we will stop and see is a cemetery in Haifa with the graves of two Mormon missionaries who died over 110 years ago. Find out why this is important.

The Orson Hyde Park located on the Mount of Olives and adjacent to the BYU Jerusalem Center is a beautiful setting. Looking up at the eastern Golden Gate of the Temple Mount, people use the park for rest and meditation --we will too!

You will have the opportunity to walk where Jesus walked, see where He lived, taught and performed miracles. The more you know about the land of Jesus, the more you'll understand and appreciate the scriptures. Indeed, once you've been to the Holy Land you will never look at your scriptures the same way again. Years of wondering are washed away, finally replaced with the images of reality.

Bring your family and friends. Immerse yourselves in the spirit of the Holy Land.
